Mr. Leather Akron Contest



This year's contest was one of the most difficult for the three judges: Ranger Todd Zampa (Mr. Leather Akron 2018), Carleton Nash (Mr. Ohio Leather 2020), and James Orosz (Mr. Cleveland Leather 2020). Each judge was charged with evaluating four strong contestants: Noble LaPier, Don Childs, James Dixon, and Mitch Ludwick. The categories were private interview, leather image, speech, and personality. Although the contestants ranged in age from their late 20's through mid-50's, each one proved to be a "quality" contestant. Gregg Lakota, who owns and produces this contest, was the emcee of the evening and noted how even he was unable to determine who the winner of the contest would be. After Keith Green (Mr. Leather Akron 2019) gave his step-aside speech, the winner was announced. The scores ranged from 89% to 86%. The first runner-up was Ranger James Dixon with a score of 89.4%, just .2% behind the winner who had a score of 89.6%. Congratulations go to this year's Mr. Leather Akron 2020, Don Childs.
