To officially celebrate its 30th anniversary, the Rangers held a "30th Anniversary Bar Night" at the Leather Stallion Saloon in Cleveland on March 2nd. Then came the cutting of the 30th anniversary cake. This year's cake symbolized the Rangers' longevity. It consisted of two tiers of chocolate and white cake, covered in thick, white, creamy frosting. The top tier was decorated with an exact replica of the Ranger logo. It was a sight to be seen! The cake itself was huge, large enough for 200 people.

At 11:00 PM and at midnight, there were two more raffle drawings with over 20 gifts given out for each one. Overall, over 70 gifts were given away, which was our way of thanking the community.
